Iiro Kakko has been an Observer and Member of IRF Council representing Finland and northern Europe since 31 October 2000. He has been a strong advocate and supporter of rogaining in Europe, an advocate of elite rogaining, and a source of sound words and advice for the IRF Executive throughout. He has not been one to broadcast loud messages widely through the IRF, but has been willing to send concise but pertinent messages directly when he feels matters are

important. For several years he spoke on behalf of reasoned courteous discussion amongst rogainers which led to adoption of our Code of Conduct in 2007. One of Iiro's important roles was alerting the Executive to trends in European rogaining since the mid 1990s and identifying areas where we might add our support to local events and leaders.
